<b>Entry Criteria</b>	<p><i>Either</i></p> <p>(i) Minimum <b>4 'O' levels</b> (with English) or equivalent and <b>18 years</b> as of 1 September 2011 and <b>Diploma in Law Admissions Test (DLAT)</b></p> <p><i>Or</i></p> <p>(ii) <b>2 'A' levels</b> or equivalent + <b>3 'O' levels</b> (with English) and <b>17 years</b> as of 1 September 2011</p> <p><i>Or</i></p> <p>(iii) <b>Poly Diploma</b> and <b>17 years</b> as of 1 September 2011</p>																														
<b>Course Structure</b>	All applicants will be required to sit for the Diploma in Law Admissions Test and be offered a place on the Diploma. Upon successfully completing the Diploma in Law, students would be eligible for the 2 <sup>nd</sup> year of the Bachelor of Laws (LL.B) awarded by the University of London.
