- Students on the Diploma in Psychology will be attending introductory courses in various areas of Psychology.

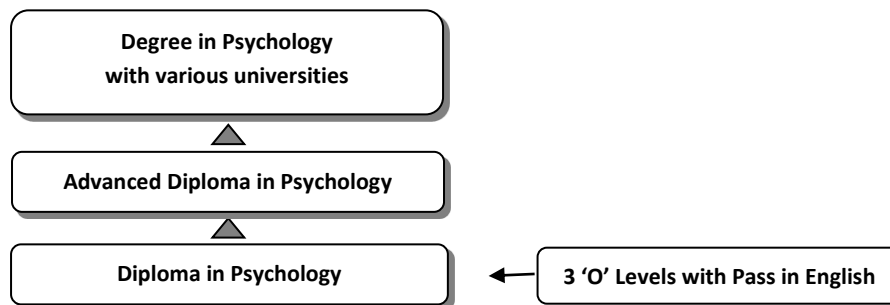
